Core Skills – essential foundation skills for all students to learn

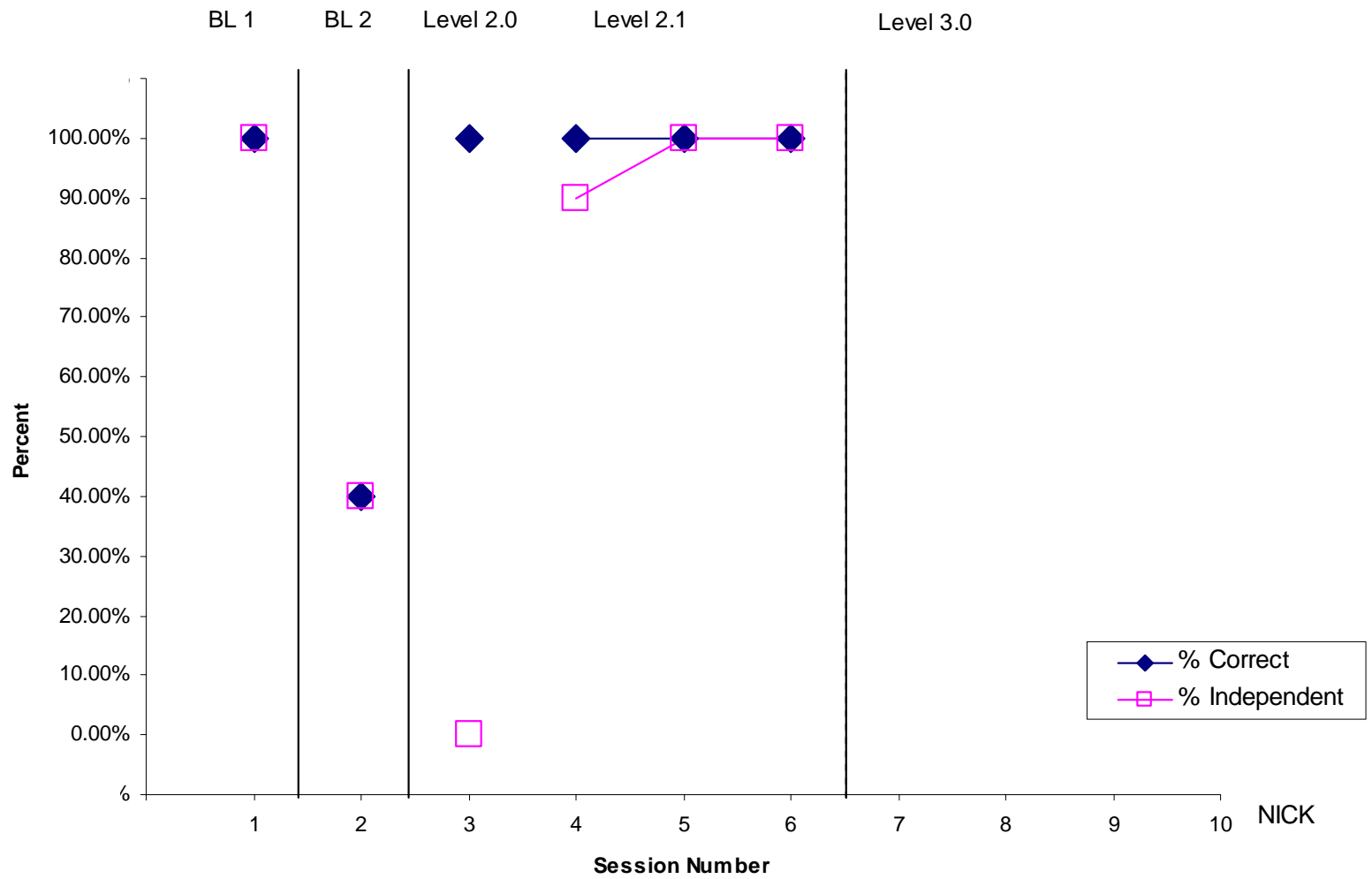

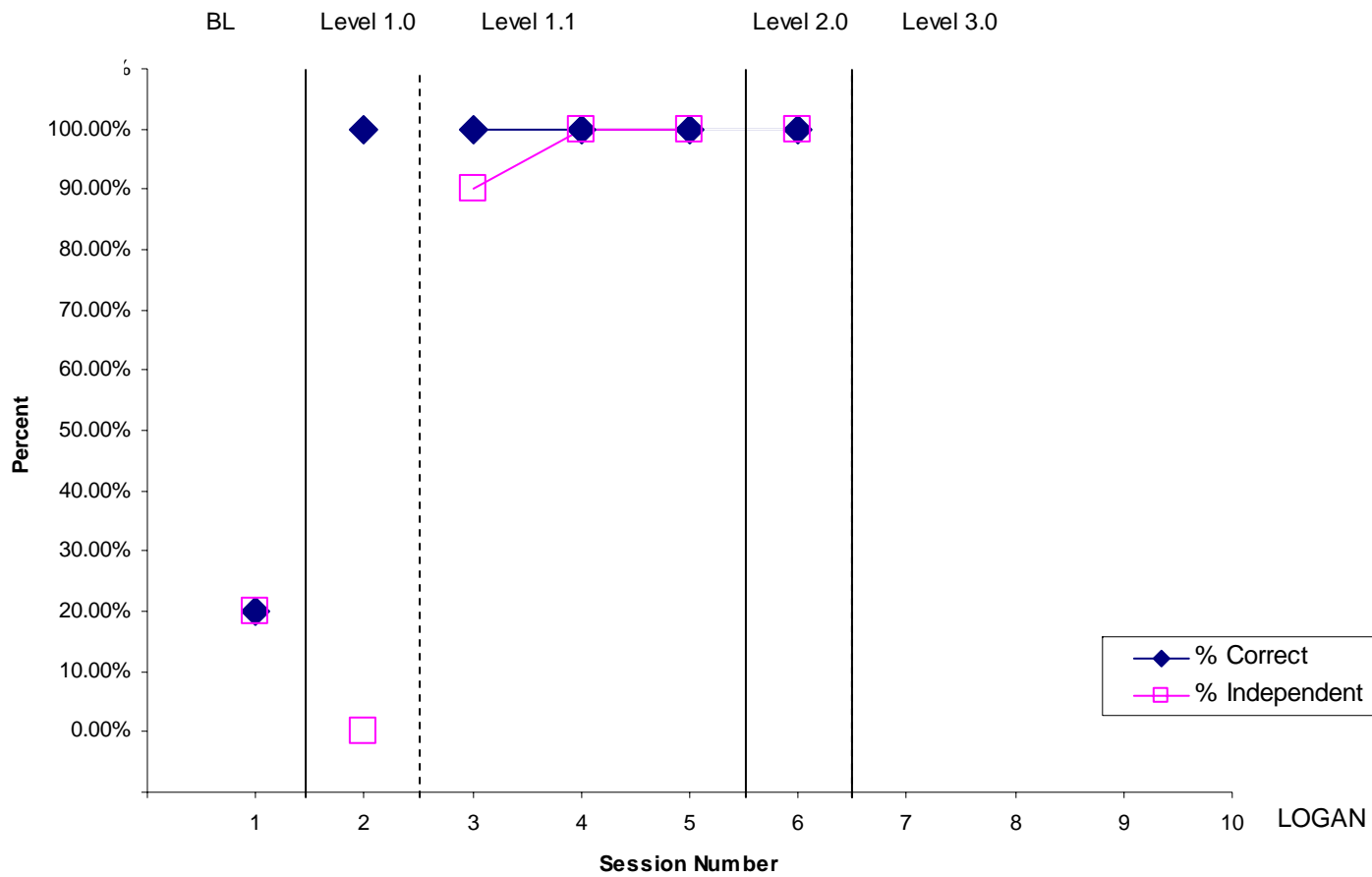


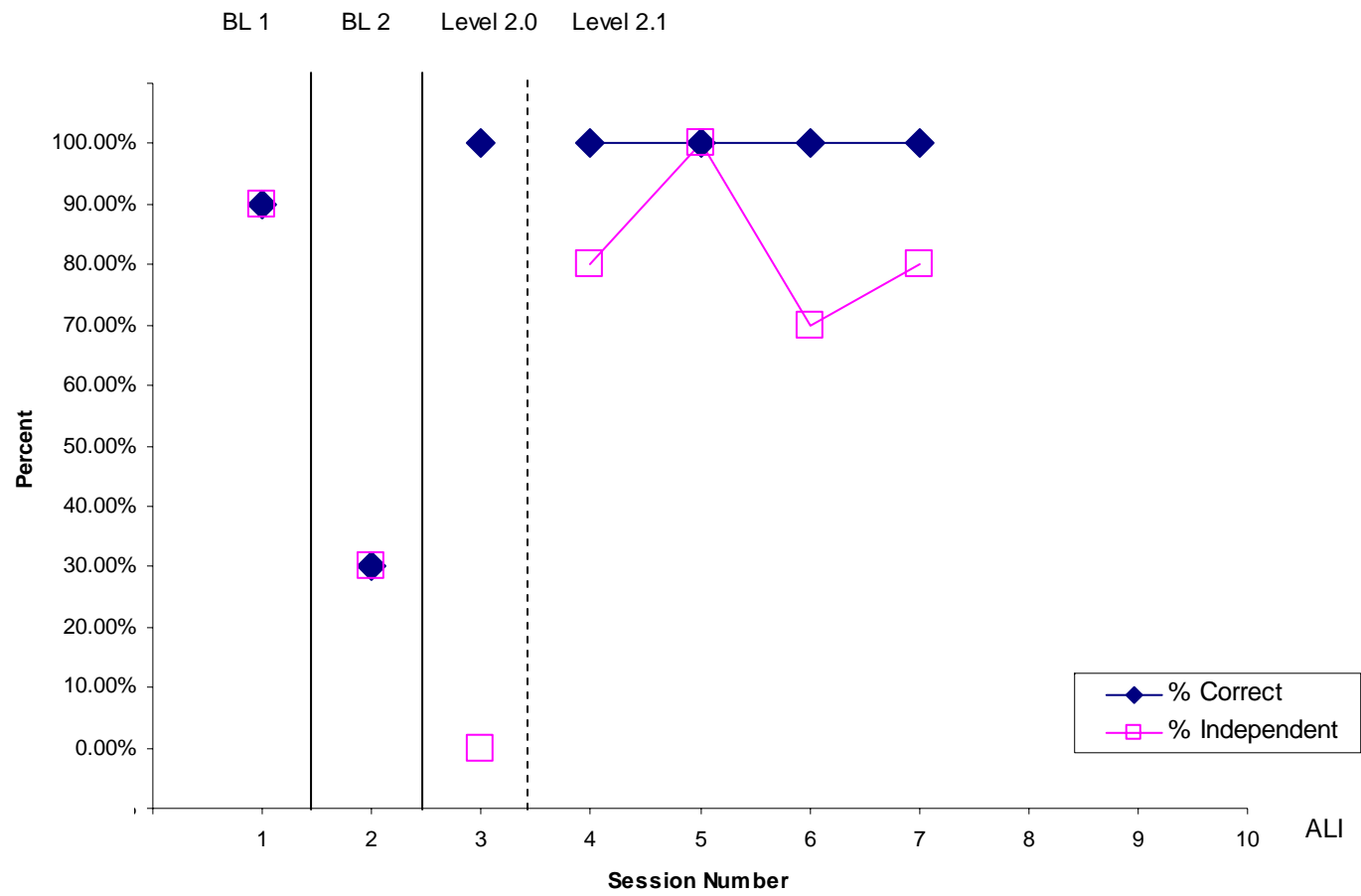


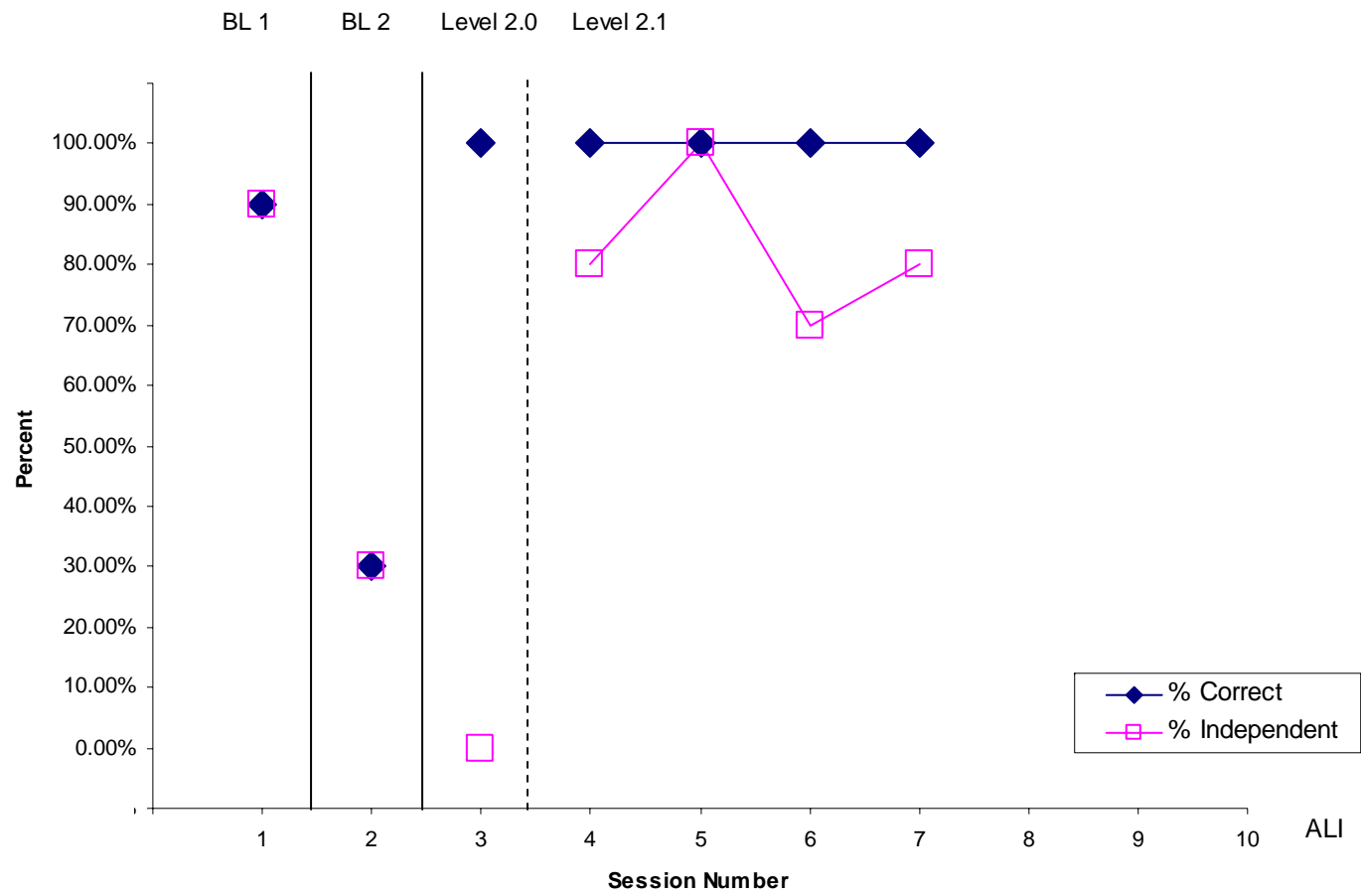












Object Imitation
